Review of: Woodland Park ZooIf you're visiting Seattle and looking for something fun, family-friendly, and a little magical, Woodland Park Zoo is a must. The zoo is tucked away in a lush, green part of the city, and it feels more like walking through a peaceful park than a typical tourist attraction. I loved how natural everything felt, with winding paths, tall trees, and little hidden viewing spots. We visited in January so just be aware that during the colder months not all the animals are out. It's still beautiful to walk around, however, you may be a little disappointed if you expect to see everything. The animals seemed well cared for in spacious enclosures, and the zoo itself is huge. Perfect for a family outing, a date, or even a solo adventure. Highly recommend!A lot of missing animals, good when you see them!The zoo has a lot of potential, but when we went so many of the enclosures were empty, closed, or barely had any. The first hour we definitely saw more empty enclosures than ones with animals which was not a hit for the kids who used up all of their walking energy early. The following were all empty when we were there, rhinos, giraffes, tapir, hippos, wolf, mountain goats, sloth bear, ostrich, lemurs, gorillas, bird enclosures. The habitats for them look great, but it was exhausting looking for animals that weren't in any of the view points. Tiger, orangutan, gazelle, patas monkey, and the warthog we saw only glimpse of as they were in the back or moved away On the other hand, we got great views of 2 big lions and 2 elk, and some up close experiences with the lynx (probably my favorite), 2 brown bears, and a jaguar. There were a couple unique animals like the warty pig and sea eagles.
