It is recommended that you complete the three questions identified with asterisks (e.g., identify the highest education level that you have attained to date). Attending Institution(s) or A-Code Find the code preceded by an RA identifying the institution where you received your graduate education in Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology and enter the code number on the registration form (e.g., for Auburn University, RA0007 - enter 0007). Designated Score Recipient(s) or R-Code Find the code(s) preceded by an R or RA for up to three institutions that you designate to receive your exam score and enter the code number(s) on the registration form. For ASHA certification, exam results must be sent directly to ASHA from ETS (select code R5031 and enter 5031). It is recommended that you have your score sent to your academic institution (e.g., for Auburn University, RA0007 - enter 0007). For example, those planning to teach elementary school typically must pass exams such as Praxis Elementary Education, which cover a broad range of topics, while those planning to teach a specific subject at the secondary school level must pass a Praxis single subject exam.
